MCH – Helene Kaiwi	<p>CDR/MMR: Legislation has been passed to reestablish the Child Death Review and create a Maternal Mortality Review. SB 2317 signed into law July 5, 2016 as Act 203.</p>	



	<p>Home Visiting (HV) Program: Partnership between Injury Prevention (Core VIPP Grant) and MCHB's HV Program to prevent child abuse/neglect and intimate partner violence.</p> <p>Sexual Violence Prevention Program: DOH MCHB will partner with DHS Child Welfare Services Branch on a Dept. of Justice, Office for Victims of Crimes grant to improve outcomes for children and youth victims of sex trafficking.</p> <p>Coaching Boys Into Men, an evidence-based curriculum involving high school coach-to-athlete trainings that illustrate ways to model respect and promote healthy relationships, thereby preventing sexual assault.</p> <p>Safe Sleep is a National outcome measure for DOH's Title V Block Grant (of the Social Security Act), U. S. Maternal and Child Health Bureau. Goal is to educate birth mother and families to maintain a safe sleep position and environment for infants. This will be done by promoting AAP safe sleep protocols in Hawaii birthing hospitals.</p> <p>The Department of Health will partner with Hawaii's 12 birthing hospitals to present a common message and information in October, which is Safe Sleep month. Plans include providing parents of each infant born that month with the "Sleep Baby, Safe and Snug" hard back book which is written by a father whose son died. DOH is in the process of looking for funding support for the book which costs \$2.00 each.</p>	
Prevent Child Abuse Hawaii	Aileen Deese – PCAH provides positive parenting skills, established 35 years ago. September 10-19 Annual Family Resource and Teddy Bear Drive providing as many as 200,000 teddy bears for children in crisis.
