New Business	Hawai'i Kids Count – Ivette Stern Tracks status of children using data to effect policies that involve children. 16 indicators, Hawai'i ranks 23/50, slipped in ranking since 2000's. Good news: teen birth rate down; high school grad number up; substance abuse down. Bad news: increase of children growing up in economic hardship; increase poverty rate; increase # of children w/parents w/o employment; increase # of children living in high poverty neighborhoods. 1/3 of children growing up in household's w/low income. Encouraging news: policy recommendations are consistent with local efforts that aim to increase opportunity and decrease poverty. Safe Kids – Lisa Dau	Safe Travel for Children of Special Needs was held at Shriners on August 29-30; 19 participants (current car seat techs); sponsored by DOT and KIPC Child Passenger safety week was held on Sept 18-24, with National Seat Check Day on Sept 24 at Waipio Shopping Center, good media coverage leading up to the event thanks to DTRIC for assisting KIPC/KMC on this. More than 60 seats were checked that day.	
IPCS – Nick Hines	Drowning Prevention: sub-committee collaborative with partners from DOE met to discuss drowning prevention. All drowning responses, failed and saved, are being analyzed Motivational Interviewing: looking for someone with skill set, and looking to create videos of training.	
CPS – Karen Tessier	4 seat check events – Kaiser, KMC, Castle and QMC DOT is currently running 2 PSAs on car seat safety, one on booster seats and the other on extended rear-facing until the age of 2. Considering introducing car seat law revisions to include rear-facing until 2 and increasing booster seat age to 10.

The quilters provide over 1,000 quilts to families of young babies. Lisa has developed a PP & pre-post quiz. <p>Sexual Violence Prevention and Child Abuse and Neglect (Helene Kaiwi)</p> <p>Sexual Violence (SV) Prevention Program has invited partners who work on sexual violence prevention to view the documentary, “Audrey & Daisy”, followed by a discussion. This documentary, available on Netflix, is of 2 teenage girls who were sexually assaulted by boys they considered to be friends, and their assault was recorded and shared amongst their peers through social media. Current MCHB prevention efforts are looking at ways to promote positive changes to the culture of sexual assault and this is addressed in the documentary, including: understanding</p>	
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	<p>consent, bystander intervention, and creating healthy relationships.</p> <p>Child Abuse/Neglect (CAN) Prevention Program: Title V of the Social Security Act, provides funding to the DOH to address maternal and child health issues. Hawaii's Title V Plan has a number of priority issues, including CAN. MCHB plans to provide training and technical assistance to promote safe, healthy and respectful relationships to prevent CAN. This will be done through collaboration across MCHB programs including: CAN, SV, Domestic Violence, Home Visiting, and Parenting Support.</p>
